HALIFAX - 3 Days | Atlantic Coast Student Tour

DAY 1

7:30 AM: Board your motor coach and depart for Halifax. Your Tour Leader will meet the group in Halifax.

1:15 PM: Explore Halifax Seaport Farmers' Market. The Halifax Farmers' Market, now known as the Halifax Seaport Farmers' Market, is the oldest, continuously operating farmers' market in North America. It was established by royal decree in 1750, just one year after the establishment of Halifax itself.

1:30 PM: Lunch

2:30 PM: Pier 21 Visit and Multi-Media Show. Visit the Pier 21 Exhibition Hall for the chance to see the story of Canada's immigration history. This visit will include a guided tour, a screening of "In Canada," and access to the Pier 21 Resources Centre.

4:30 PM: Orientation Walk along Halifax Harbour with your Tour

6:30 PM: Dinner at Murphy's on Cable Wharf. Enjoy a group dinner in historic downtown Halifax, overlooking the harbour.

8:00 PM: Hotel Check-In

DAY 2

8:00 AM: Breakfast

9:00 AM: Peggy's Cove and Lunenburg Tour. Meet a local guide at your accommodations and depart for Peggy's Cove.

10:15 AM: Explore Peggy's Cove. Visit the historic Lighthouse at Peggy's Cove. Don't forget to take a picture for mom and dad. A stop will be made at the memorial for the ill-fated Swiss Air flight 111.

11:30 AM: Board your motor coach and depart for Lunenburg via Mahone Bay.

12:30 PM: Photo Stop at Mahone Bay. The view across the harbour of the three churches: St. James' Anglican, St. John's Lutheran and Trinity United, has become an iconic image of Nova Scotia.

1:15 PM: Explore Old Town Lunenburg. Lunenburg, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, was established in 1753 as the first British colony in North America outside of Halifax. View Bluenose II. A trip to Nova Scotia would not be complete without viewing the Bluenose II, a perfect example of Nova Scotia's fabled Tall Ships. Lunenburg is the home port of Bluenose II and the birthplace of the original Bluenose.

1:30 PM: Lunch

3:30 PM: Board your motor coach and return to Halifax.

5:00 PM: Orientation tour of Point Pleasant Park. This historic, 75-hectare, wooded park on the south end of Halifax is rented from the British Government for 1 shilling (about 10 cents) a year, with a 999-year lease!

6:30 PM: Dinner

DAY 3

8:00 AM: Breakfast

9:00 AM: Hotel Check Out

10:00 AM: Guided Tour of the Halifax Citadel. Walk along the

ramparts of the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site while your tour guide tells you stories about this special place and what life was like for the soldiers stationed here in the late 1800s. You will hear how this fort played a key role in

the growth of Halifax and Canada.

11:30 AM: Maritime Museum of the Atlantic. Learn about the history of the East Coast on this self-guided visit.

1:00 PM: Board your motor coach and depart for home.

Appropriate rest and meal stops will be made en route.
